XII Roadshow: Presentation of the Natural Infrastructure Projects of the Autoridad para la Reconstrucción con Cambios (ARCC) within the framework of the G2G between Peru and the United Kingdom

ARCC

Is a temporary authority circumscribed to the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, created in 2017, to restore damaged infrastructure after the natural disaster of El Niño Costero 2017: 11,205 interventions in 13 regions of the country: Ancash, Arequipa, Ayacucho, Cajamarca, Huancavelica, Ica, Junin, La Libertad, Lambayeque, Lima, Loreto, Piura y Tumbes.

During the last 18 months, the ARCC has incremented 2.6 times the number of finished projects compared with its 3 first years of existence, turning into one of the most dynamic forces of the national economy and obtaining the highest figures of public investment performance of the last 20 years, notwithstanding the pandemic.

<u>G2G</u>

The G2G between Peru and the United Kingdom signed in June 2020, is a mechanism of collaborative work between two governments allowing the steady mutual help on the implementation of high-performance prevention projects on natural disasters: technical assessment, selection and hiring processes, project management and knowledge transfer.

Through the G2G, the ARCC will rebuilt 74 schools in 8 regions, 15 health facilities in 5 regions and the integrated solutions of 17 rivers, 5 gorges and 7 drainage systems in 7 regions.

Accomplished goals

26 signed contracts between December 2021 and June 2021, corresponding to 105 interventions for more than S/. 6,100 million soles:

- 15 health facilities for more than S/.1255 million soles –100% signed contracts portfolio
- 74 schools for more than 779 million soles 100% signed contracts portfolio
- 10 packages of Integrated solutions* for more than S/ 3,944 millions

*The Integrated solutions have three components:

- Component A: River defenses to prevent overflows.
- Component B: Dams to make it possible for the exceeding water to be used, for instance, on agriculture.
- Component C: <u>Implementation of natural infrastructure</u> to intervene the neighboring ground of the basins and avoid land sliding. The ARCC will execute a megaproject never done before in the region with the intervention of 51 thousand hectares nationwide (afforested, revegetated, protected).

- On Tuesday, July 13th, a closed Roadshow will take place, jointly organized with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, with the aim of introducing the first natural infrastructure project to prevent floods in the basins of the Tumbes and Zaña rivers (Tumbes and Lambayeque regions).
- With both interventions it is estimated that more than 3900 hectares will be afforested.
- Additionally, there will also be infiltration trenches, slow-growing terraces, and dams to control gullies.
- There will be a life Zoom streaming with a link available on the preceding days of the event for its dissemination.

Why is this roadshow special? Integrated solutions with natural infrastructure

As part of the early warning approach that defines the national process of rebuilding with changes, systemic and environmentally sustainable interventions are proposed. Accordingly, the integrated solutions combine conventional and natural infrastructure to protect the population from floods and possible mass movements throughout the interventions on the 17 basins. With this roadshow starts the procurement process of the enterprise that will execute the first project of this sort nationwide.
